## **Loyalty Loyalty**

- In Hebrew, khesed is a noun meaning "loyal love"
- Khesed is best described as a relational trait between two people or groups. It assumes a pre-existing relationship and refers to actions that demonstrate a commitment to the protection, preservation, and flourishment of said relationship.

## **Loyalty Loyalty**

- Depending on your Bible's translation, khesed has been translated to mean
  - > Mercy
  - Lovingkindness or mercy
  - > Steadfast love
  - Love or unfailing love
- Out of all the mentions of khesed (245 in the OT), 75% of them are referencing God's khesed

#### Human Acts of Khesed

- People do khesed when they fulfill their commitments to another person in their immediate and/or extended family. Notable examples include:
  - > Jacob's sons bury their father Genesis 47:28-30
  - > Ruth stays with and supports Naomi Ruth 1:16-17
- ❖ People also do *khesed* when they fulfill their commitment to someone they've made a covenant agreement with. Notable examples include:
  - > Abraham to Abimelech Genesis 21:22-24
  - David to Jonathan and Jonathan's son 2 Samuel 9:1-7

#### Summarize Human Khesed

- Khesed is when someone treats another as a close friend or family member, doing what is necessary to ensure their well-being and the health of the relationship. While the action may be an obligation or duty, khesed also refers to the emotional motivation of love that drives expressions of generosity and care.
  - > Give an example of when you showed *khesed* to someone
  - > Give an example of when someone showed khesed to you

#### Human Acts of Khesed

- People do khesed when treat someone as if they are in a committed relationship (even if they're not). Notable examples include:
  - Pharaoh's winemaker to Joseph Genesis 40:12-14
  - > The spies to Rahab Joshua 2:12-15

## God's Khesed to His People

- Throughout Israel's history, God shows many acts of khesed
  - ➤ Genesis 32:9-12 →God promises to protect Jacob and his offspring
  - ➤ Exodus 15:11-13 →God rescued Israel from slavery in Egypt
  - Numbers 14:11-19 →God forgives Israel's rebellion in the account of the spies
  - ➤ 2 Samuel 7:12-18 → God remains committed to David's family

## God's Khesed to His People

- In Psalms, God's khesed is mainly expressed by saving people from disaster, death, and/or oppression
  - > Psalm 31:7-8, Psalm 94:16-18, Psalm 57:2-5
- God's acts of khesed in the past are the basis for hope of future khesed in the restoration from the exile
  - > Psalm 44:23-26
- God's khesed is what motivates forgiveness of his covenant people's failure and rebellion
  - > Psalm 51:1-2

## People Showing Khesed to God

- In seeking out a covenant partner, God desires that His people show *khesed* to Him, just as He has shown *khesed* to them. Israel is supposed to demonstrate their *khesed* by honoring their terms of their covenant with God, but they fail repeatedly
  - > Hosea 4:1-2
- Israel's khesed is contrasted with God's
  - > Hosea 6:4-6
- The destruction of Israel in the exile was an act of God's anger, and their restoration will only happen as a result of God's khesed
  - > Micah 7:18-20

#### Khesed in the New Testament - Eleos

- In the NT, khesed got translated to the Greek word for mercy, eleos
  - This translation is used 221 times in the NT
- The Hebrew meaning of *khesed* is evident in many NT uses of eleos
  - > Luke 1:45-55
  - > Ephesians 2:1-5
    - Paul uses the phrase "rich in mercy" as an equivalent to saying "great in loyal love"

## Jesus, God's Khesed in the Flesh

- God's ultimate act of khesed and His loyalty to his covenants made to Abraham, Noah, and David are embodied in Jesus.
- Jesus came to receive and show God's khesed and to restore the partnership between God and humanity
- Compare the opening chapter of John with key passages from the OT
  - > John 1:14 → Exodus 25:8-9
  - > Exodus 33:20-22
  - > Exodus 34:6-7
